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The Divine Mother and Her Prayer

The Lord's Prayer helps us to connect with our Father who is in secret, but there is also a pray to connect with our Divine Mother, the Virgin of Carmel:

THE Gnostic HAIL MARY

*God hails you RAM-IO (Mary),
full of grace;
the Lord is with thee.*

*Blessed art you among women,
and blessed is the fruit of your womb
"IHESUS".*

*Virgin RAM-IO, Mother of God,
pray for us sinners,
those who have the sinning "I";
now and at the hour of the death of our defects ("Ts").*

AMEN.

NOTE: This Prayer, and the Lord's Prayer, must be said by all Gnostics before going to bed, or in moments of danger.

The Heart Temple and the Gnostic Church

Our Gnostic Movement is made up of people from all religions, schools, sects, spiritual societies, etc. In the Heart-Temple there is place for all religions, for all worship. Jesus said: "In loving one another thou shalt prove that thou art my disciples."

The Gnostic Rituals, Religious Ceremonies are authentic treatises of Occult Wisdom for the person who knows how to meditate, for those who comprehend with the heart. The one who wishes to tread the Path of the Tranquil Heart, should concentrate the Prana, Life and the Sexual Energy in the cerebrum and concentrate the mind in the Heart. It is Urgent to learn to think with the heart, to deposit the mind in the Heart Temple. The Cross of Initiation is always received in the marvelous Temple of the Heart.

The Gnostic Church preserves all the Secret Doctrine of the Adorable Savior of the world. It is the religion of happiness and beauty. It is the virginal trunk from which arose Romanism and all other sects that adore the Christ. The Gnostic Church is the only church that secretly preserves the Doctrine which Christ taught by oral tradition to his disciples. Let's study the 3rd chapter from the 1st Epistle of St. Paul the Apostle to Timothy:

"This is a true saying: if a man desires the office of a bishop, he aspires to a good work. He who becomes a bishop must be blameless, the husband of one wife, mentally alert, sober, of good behavior, given to hospitality, and apt at teaching; Not given to wine, not hasty to strike, not quarrelsome, but meek, not greedy for monetary rewards; One who rules well his own household and keeps his children under subjection to bring them up with all purity. (For if a man does not know how to rule well his own household, how shall he take care of the Church of God?) He should not be a novice, lest he become proud and fall into the judgment of the devil. Moreover, he must have a good report from outsiders, lest he fall into reproach and the snares of the devil."

"Likewise, deacons must be pure, not double-tongued, not given to much wine, not greedy of filthy lucre; But they must uphold the divine mystery of faith with a pure conscience. Let these first be examined, and then let them minister after they have been found blameless. Likewise their wives must be chaste, mentally alert, faithful in all things, and not slanderers. Let the deacons be appointed from those who have not been polygamous, ruling their children and their own households well. For those who minister well earn good recognition for themselves and grow more familiar with the faith of Jesus Christ."

“These things I write to you, although hoping to come to you shortly; So that if I am delayed, you may know how you ought to conduct yourself in the house of God, which is the Church of the living God, the pillar and foundation of the Truth. Truly great is this divine mystery of righteousness; it is revealed in the flesh, justified in the Spirit, seen by angels, preached unto the Gentiles, believed on in the world, and received up into glory.”

This is from the Epistle of St. Paul the Apostle to St. Timothy, a pious man, and fearful of God. This is the Holy Doctrine of St. Augustine, St. Thomas, Clement of Alexandria, Hippolytus, Epiphanius, Carpocrates whom founded several monasteries in Spain, Tertullian, St. Ambrose, St. Stephen (who died a martyr), St. Justinian, etc. This is the old doctrine that Christ taught in secret to his 70 disciples, and for which the Saints of Jerusalem were persecuted. This is the doctrine of the great sovereigns of the Church; this is the doctrine of the Gnostics, to which belong all the high dignitaries of the original Gnostic Catholic Church.

This is the Ancient Christianity that St. Paul preached when he arrived in Rome bound in chains. This is the Christianity that the Virgin of Carmel studied under the august shade of the temple of Jerusalem. St. Paul advised all good Christians to practice charity, to acquire spiritual gifts, and above all that they prophesy. All good Christians can receive the Holy Spirit and prophesy. However, he who wants to become a prophet has to become completely chaste and holy.

The Church of Our Lord Jesus Christ is not of this world, as he himself said, “My kingdom is not of this world.” On the mount of the Living God there is a church that is invisible to the eyes of the flesh, but visible to the eyes of the soul and the Spirit. This is the original Gnostic Church, to which Christ and the prophets belong. This Church has its Bishops, Archbishops, Deacons, Archdeacons, and Priests who officiate on the Altar of the Living God. The Patriarch of this invisible Church is Jesus Christ.

All Christians can go to this Church in soul and in Spirit. All human beings can also visit the Gnostic Church during sleep. There, in that Holy Church, we see the Virgin of Carmel and her holy angels with her. All the great Saints of the Church of God visit the Gnostic Church. On Fridays and Sundays at dawn there are masses and communions. All Christians can attend these masses and receive the communion of the bread and wine by living in accordance with the Gnostic Teachings: working to Awaken the Consciousness and learning to Travel in Astral.

In the Gnostic Church we see Christ seated on his throne, and all of us Gnostics can converse with him personally. All of Mary's sufferings followed after she was wed to Joseph the Priest. Mary was initiated into the mysteries of Egypt. In the Gnostic Church, Christians learn how to prophesy. The most important thing is to follow the path of perfect Chastity and Sanctity.

We are not against any religion. We invite the people of all holy religions who adore the Lord to study our secret doctrine. We should not forget that there exists rituals of light and of darkness. We possess the secret rituals of the Adorable Savior of the world. We neither scorn nor underestimate any religion. All religions are very precious pearls strung upon the golden thread of Divinity. We only affirm that Gnosis is the flame from which all the religions of the Universe emerge. That is all.

Fortunate is the one who has a Guru-Deva as a guide and director. Blessed be the one who has found the Master of Perfection. The path is narrow, strait and frighteningly difficult. One needs the Guru-Deva, the director, the guide. In the Heart-Temple we will find HARI, the Being, the Guru-Deva. In India, one who serves the true Guru-Deva is called a Samyasin of the mind. This person has found the Guru-Deva in the heart and who works in the Dissolution of the Lunar Ego. Whoever wants to put an end to the Ego (the "I") should annihilate Anger, Covetousness, Lust, Envy, Pride, Laziness, Gluttony. It is only by putting an end to all those defects in all the Levels of the Mind, that the "I" dies in a radical, total and definite manner. Meditation on the name HARI (the Being), permits us to experience what is Real, authentic.
